City Administrator in Lansing

- Lansing has a Mayor elected citywide every four years-Tony McNeill
 - Eight Councilmembers from Four Wards (Staggered Terms)
 - Eight Different Departments Within Lansing (soon to be Nine)
 - City Clerk (HR), Finance, Library, Wastewater, Police, Community
 & Economic Development, Public Works, Parks & Recreation
 - About 60 Employees (soon to be over 70, + Seasonal lifeguards)

City Administrator in Lansing

- Depending on the day, I'm involved in human resources, budget, parks, community relations, and development decisions. The variety is one of the things I love most about this job, but also one of the most challenging aspects of the job.
- I'm passionate about good-government. The City Management movement began over 100 years ago in response to spoils systems in larger cities. This form of government emphasizes expertise and professionalism rather than who you're friends with.
- The City Administrator's job is to implement the Governing Body's vision, goals, and priorities
- We love Lansing! One of the safest cities around. Great School District. Wonderful location in proximity to KCI, Legends, Zona Rosa, downtown, etc.

What the City Administrator Doesn't Do...

- We have no control over school district (their busing policy, their budget, their administration, etc.)
- No influence over County issues (a resident outside of Lansing complaining to me about XYZ)
- We recruit businesses, but we cannot just call Target/Kohls/Chipoltle and tell them to build or open a business (golf course example)
- We do not have absolute authority over private property. There is a balance between City authority and respecting private property rights

 - Access off East Eisenhower & Alley-Approved by KDOT
 - Met City's rules and regulations
 - Very Tight Fit!
 - Stay In Your Car-Oil change in 5-10 minutes



K7/Eisenhower Intersection

- Major Improvements to K7/Eisenhower Intersection, 31,000 vehicles per day
 - Joint project with City of Leavenworth & KDOT
 - Construction Bid of \$1.6M awarded to Linaweaver Construction
 - KDOT Grant covers 80%, Lansing covering remaining 2/3; LV 1/3
 - Addition of southbound dedicated right turn lane in front of QT
 - Addition of northbound dual left turn lanes
 - Completed Last Year

Aquatic Center Update

- Approved by Voters 50.3% to 49.7% margin
- On pace for May 2025 Opening
- Splash pad included, which allows usage after pool closes
- .45% sales tax for 20 years to fund a new aquatic center at West Mary & Bittersweet (directly west of LES)
- \$7.4M
- Not funded by property taxes
 - Residents from other towns/states are helping to fund construction via sales taxes
- Royal Construction General Contractor
 - Linaweaver Subcontractor

Sewer Extensions South Along K7

- Plans to extend sewer to McIntyre Road
- Project could be split up in phases, \$1.75M-\$4M
 - Willow Park south along K7 in front of Rock Creek Loop, cross under K7 to NW portion of 148acre parcel, follow draw to McIntyre
- Sewer Availability Begets Growth
- This project creates hundreds of acres of potential growth along K7 corridor in Lansing



Bridge on DeSoto

- All Bridges in Lansing Are Inspected Annually
 - All are safe, but bridge along 147th needs replacement
 - Functionally Obsolete
 - No Trucks Over 9,200 LBs
 - 14,500 Vehicles Per Day
 - Estimated \$1.3M cost
 - New bridge would be wider and have trail capability on east side




Recent Drainage Projects


- Drainage Pipe Project on Southfork-\$60,000 Linaweaver Construction
